



Located on the Humboldt Bay on California's North Coast, with a population of 27,000.



The county seat and cultural center of world-famous Humboldt County.



The entire historic Old Town district is on the National Register of Historic Places, and features more than 150 buildings from the Victorian era.



Robust trail systems include a 6-mile waterfront trail along Humboldt Bay.



20 city parks and nearby seven state and national parks, including Redwood National and State Parks.



The Redwood Sky Walk at Sequoia Park Zoo features a series of platforms and bridges that rise 100ft into the redwoods and was voted Best Aerial Attraction by USA Today readers in 2023.



The coastal location makes the region great for water sports like kayaking, paddle boarding, and charter fishing.



Built in 1910, the M/V Madaket is the oldest passenger motor vessel in continuous service in the entire United States. It also has the smallest licensed bar in the state of California and offers guided tours on Humboldt Bay.



Blue Ox Millworks and Historic Village, featured in the hit series "The Craftsman," is open to the public for tours and classes.



The North Coast enjoys a hyper-local food scene, and Humboldt Bay is the largest producer of oysters in the state of California.
